

Nacogdoches County's Voting System

Nacogdoches County currently uses Hart Intercivic's Verity Voting System.

All voters cast paper ballots in Nacogdoches County. There are no ballots that are cast and stored only in a digital format. For the vast majority of voters, you will simply show ID and sign for a ballot and receive a paper ballot that you will mark with a pen and then deposit into a metal ballot box.

Nacogdoches County owns 18 Verity Touch Writer units equipped with Verity Access for voters with disabilities. Each polling place will have one Verity Touch Writer available for voters with disabilities. No electronic votes are stored on these units, the units are only used by voters to make choices. A voter verifiable paper ballot is printed for the voter with the voter's choices at the end of the process. The voter then puts the paper ballot into the same metal ballot box that all other voters use at the polling place. Again, the Touch Writer is not "electronic voting", it is an electronic tool that voters with disabilities may use to mark paper ballots.

Nacogdoches County has a Central Count location on Election Night where all ballot boxes are delivered for counting. We use 4 high speed Canon ImageFormula DR-G1100 scanners for processing paper ballots with Hart Intercivic's Verity Central software. We also use Hart Intercivic's Verity Count software to tabulate votes on Election Night.

For checking in voters, Nacogdoches County uses Poll Pads created by KnowInk.
